It will remain dry through the afternoon with some sunny spells developing as skies begin to clear. Clear spells will continue into the evening, before cloud starts to increase after midnight. Some snow may move into the area from the south by around 1100, but there is some uncertainty whether this will reach areas north of Warwickshire before the end of the forecast period. Areas further north, for example, Staffordshire are likely to stay dry through the morning.
